NEW DIVISION OF ORAL HEALTH STAFF

Yolanda Hiller, BSBA joined the Division of Oral Health team as a Program Coordinator, primarily focusing on Communications and Community Outreach as it relates to the Medical and Dental Integration (MDI) Initiative. She will be working closely with the DHEC Health Regions to integrate oral health and diabetes at the local level. Yolanda received a bachelor's degree in Business Administration with a Management emphasis from Limestone College.

POWER PEE DEE PROJECT (2018-2020)

Amanda McAlhany from the DHEC Division of Oral Health is the program lead for the Power Pee Dee Project. The goal of this project is to develop a network of school nurses, community-based organizations and dentists dedicated to addressing the oral health needs of school-aged children in the Pee Dee area. Currently, the initial implementation for the project has begun and school nurses in Williamsburg County have received training in basic screening surveys and telehealth skills. Soon, the project will begin to branch out to other neighboring counties by training the school nurses in those areas. A dental referral network will also be created to help assist school nurses who are referring school children to local dentists.

EXPANDING THE VIEW OF ORAL HEALTH: HPV, ORAL HEALTH AND TOBACCO

Dr. Teresa Foo, MPH, MBA from the Divisions of Immunization and Acute Disease Epidemiology presented on the important topic of *Collaboration to Prevent Head and Neck Cancers*. Dr. Foo discussed the increasing rates of HPV positive oropharyngeal cancers, and the need to screen for oral cancers. The connection between tobacco use in youths and HPV positive oropharyngeal cancers is concerning. The messaging for head and neck cancer prevention has typically relied on avoiding smoking or smoking cessation, but this can be expanded to include HPV vaccinations and regular dentist visits for oral cancer screenings. DHEC Tobacco Prevention and Control, Immunization and Oral Health Divisions are now collaborating to create prevention campaigns and improve the education about the diseases for both adults and youth. 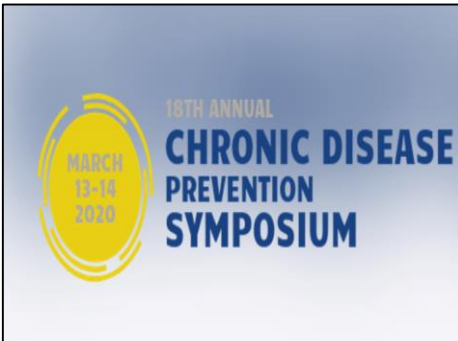
